Automotive

The Automotive Technology program offers classroom and laboratory experience, which includes all phases of maintenance on many types of automotive vehicles. Dual credit students can enroll in the AT 100 course, which is a prerequisite to the full-time program. Benefits of taking this course as dual credit is that students can gain an insight on what to expect in the world of Automotive Technology, as well as get a head start on the full-time program which can be completed in just 18 months. In the full-time program, students can earn Certificates of Completion in Power Train Systems and Chassis Systems. Students are also eligible to sit for ASE Certification exams to earn a variety of automotive industry certifications.

Days/Times: Monday – Thursday from 7:00 am – 12:15 pm

Duration of program: 1 semester

Who is Eligible: Juniors and seniors (recommend taking semester before applying to the full-time program)

Student Cost: \$25 per semester



Industrial Technology **/Electrical Maintenance**

This program is for students interested in Plant Operations/Equipment & Wind Energy and leads to a certificate in Electrical Maintenance. In addition, all courses count toward the full-time program. Upon high school graduation and successful completion of this CTE program, students can be granted admittance into the full-time program and complete requirements in 18 months earning credentials in both plant operations and wind energy. Full-time students will also have the opportunity to complete a wind turbine climb class and receive a national climb certification.

Days/Times: Monday – Friday 8:00 am – 12:00 pm

Duration of Program: 1 year

Who is eligible: Seniors only

Credentials: Students earn a Certificate of Completion in Electrical Maintenance from CCC and have skills necessary to go straight to work

Student Cost: \$15 per semester



Welding

Students who complete two years of this high school program will earn a Certificate of Completion in Entry-Level Welder from CCC and four national certificates from the American Welding Society (AWS). These AWS certificates include shielded metal arc welding, gas metal arc welding, flux-cored arc welding, and gas tungsten arc welding. Upon completion of the high school program, students can be granted admittance into the full-time program where they can complete requirements in 2 semesters and earn Advanced Welder certificates from CCC and AWS.

Days/Times: Monday - Thursday from 12:40 – 2:40 pm

Duration of Program: 1 or 2 year

Who is eligible: Juniors and Seniors

Credentials: Students earn a Certificate of Completion in Entry-Level Welder from CCC and 4 AWS Entry-Level Welding Certificates

Student Cost: \$75 per semester



COMPTIA Certificates

This program is for students who are interested in national certifications in hardware and software and/or networking. This program consists of three classes that each are a stepping stone toward a Certificate of Achievement from CCC as well as the opportunity to take an internationally recognized license exam.



Days/Times: Courses offered face-to-face and online (see current schedule for times)

Duration of program: 3 total courses

Who is Eligible: Juniors and seniors

Credentials: Students earn a Certificate of Achievement from CCC after completion of each class

Student Cost: CIST 1121--\$30 lab fee for face-to-face only

Fundamentals of Game

Design

This program is designed to provide basic skills and knowledge to meet requirements for entry-level positions in the mobile app and game design industry. Students learn fundamentals of object-oriented programming, explore digital media and design principles, are introduced to 2-D and 3-D computer animation, and become familiar with basic principles of graphic design and typography. In the capstone course, students choose a popular game development engine to create their own game with multiple levels of play. This program leads to a Certificate of Completion and is available completely online.



Days/Times: Courses offered face-to-face and online (see current schedule for times)

Duration of program: 5 courses

Who is Eligible: Juniors and seniors

Credentials: Students earn a Certificate of Completion in game design after successful completion of all 5 classes.

Student Cost: FDMA 2713, ARTS 2120, and ARTS 1520 each require special software that costs \$19.99/month.

Emergency Medical

Services

EMS professionals work closely with hospitals and fire departments and play a vital role in healthcare and public safety. This program is for seniors interested in obtaining an EMT-Basic license. This is an intensive 12-credit hour program that is offered in both the fall and spring semesters. Students are required to complete clinical hours in emergency rooms and ambulances. This program prepares students to take the EMT basic license exam.



Days/Times: Evening and Saturday classes (see current schedule for times)

Duration of program: 1 semester

Who is Eligible: Seniors who are at least 17 by the first day of class are eligible. Students must be 18 to take the license exam.

Student Cost: \$340, plus approximately \$90 for drug testing & liability insurance

Credentials: Students earn a Certificate of Achievement in EMT-Basic from CCC and are eligible to sit for the EMT-Basic license exam.

Healthcare Assistant

This program is for students interested in the healthcare industry. Students who complete this course will earn a Certificate of Achievement in Health Care Assistant from CCC and are eligible to sit for the industry certification exam. Students who pass this industry certification exam will receive their Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) and are eligible to work in a doctor's office or retirement home. This course will not transfer to the nursing program; however, it does count as additional points toward the admission process and will provide students with an opportunity for an employment credential right out of high school.



Days/Times: Monday & Wednesday OR Tuesday and Thursday from 9 to 11:30 a.m. **Duration of program:** 1 semester **Who is Eligible:** Seniors are eligible. Students must be 18 to take the CNA license exam.

Student Cost: \$40 in Spring

Credentials: Students will earn a Certificate of Achievement in Healthcare Assistant from CCC and are eligible to sit for the CNA license exam.

Phlebotomy

THIS PROGRAM NOT AVAILABLE FOR DUAL CREDIT



This program prepares students to collect and process blood specimens using approved venipuncture and capillary puncture techniques. Students who complete this CTI program will earn a Certificate of Achievement in Phlebotomy Technician from CCC. Upon completion, students are eligible to work in medical clinics, hospitals, and physician office labs. With one year of experience, students are eligible to sit for the industry certification exam to gain a national Phlebotomy license.

Days/Times: Monday-Thursday

Duration of program: 1 year

Who is Eligible: Seniors are eligible. Students must be 18 years of age in order to take the license exam.

Student Cost: Fall: \$90; Spring Estimated cost of \$120 (\$60 student fee paid to CCC for drug testing and approx. \$89 fee for fingerprinting/background check/immunizations to be completed by student.

Credentials: Students earn Certificate of Achievement in Phlebotomy Technician and with 1 year of experience are eligible to sit for the Phlebotomy license exam.
